We are committed to the concept that people can recover and lead productive lives in their community

Services:

Assessment, diagnosis and treatment for adults with chronic and severe mental health issues such as post-traumatic stress disorder, bipolar and major depressive disorders or schizophrenia.

Intervention and treatment for children who are at-risk for abuse and/or neglect or have been abused.

Provide treatment to children with severe emotional or behavioral disorders such as conduct disorders, violent classroom behavior, suicidality, or self-mutilation.

Both children and adults receive a comprehensive continuum of care from outpatient to field based services.

Psychiatric consultation and medication support for ongoing clients.

An array of evidence based practices for focused, shorter-term treatment for children when appropriate

Provide treatment for co-occurring substance abuse and mental health issues.

Case management for ongoing clients to access resources for housing, enrollment for SSI benefits, health care, insurance enrollment and vocational services.

Peer, family and peer advocates to support clients and family members when possible.

These services are primarily funded by the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health (DMH).

PROGRAMS AND CONTRACTS

- Provider of countywide Full Service Partnership services for API Adults and Children in collaboration with other API focused agencies.
- Provider of school-based counseling services for children.
- Lead agency in the Integrated Network for Cambodians (INC) program in SA8 with 5 community organizations and a federally qualified health center to provide integrated mental health, medical and substance abuse services for Cambodians of all ages including the indigent population. Community based partners will provide extensive outreach and engagement to this underserved population.
- PACS is a partner in Project ABC to develop and expand a system of care for children 0-5 in SA8, under LA County DMH and funded by SAMSHA.
- Multidisciplinary Assessment Team (MAT) provider for children newly detained by DCFS to assess and identify mental health treatment needs in SA8. Also provide linkages to other services as appropriate.
- CalWORKs provider for adults and families who need pre- and post-employment psycho-social services to overcome their barriers to employment in SA5 and SA8. The program offers individual support to find employment and Life Skills groups for enrollees.
- Provider of a variety of evidence based practices (EBP) for children and adults.
- PACS also provides a variety of groups such as parenting as needed.
